Speaking Courses

U15 ELP 1301 Conversation and Pronunciation (Medical Campus) 3 units

Section 51 MW 6:00-8:00 PM, Rebecca Coplan Goulart

May 18-August 5

This course offers practice with individual sounds, word and sentence stress, intonation, and rhythm of American English, plus conversation strategies and vocabulary expansion. Tuition: \$1545

U15 200 Speaking and Grammar I (Medical Campus) 2 units

Section 51 MTh 5:30-8:00 PM, Nancy Mayer

May 18-June 25

This is the first course in a sequence that focuses on fluency and grammatical accuracy. This course is designed for students who have already studied grammar but still have trouble with more advanced structures when speaking. Contextual practice and self-monitoring are emphasized. Tuition: \$1030

U15 201 Speaking and Grammar II (Medical Campus) 2 units

June 29-August 6

This is the second course in a sequence that focuses on fluency and grammatical accuracy. This course is designed for students who have already studied grammar but still have problems with more advanced structures when speaking. Contextual practice and self-monitoring are emphasized. Tuition: \$1030

U15 126 Intensive Speaking for International Students (Danforth Campus) 4 units

This course combines work on listening comprehension, discussion skills, and pronunciation to prepare students for full-time academic work. In addition to one section for general academic listening and speaking, separate sections are offered in which instruction is customized to meet the language demands of students entering graduate/professional programs in business and law. The class meets 12.5 hours per week for six weeks. Tuition: \$2060

U15 127 Intensive Reading and Writing for International Students (Danforth Campus) 4 units

June 22-July 31

- **Section 51** MTuWThF 1:30-4:00 PM, Karen Schwelle – For students entering the School of Law
- **Section 52** MTuWThF 1:30-4:00 PM, David Braasch – For students entering the Olin School of Business
- **Section 53** MTuWThF 1:30-4:00 PM, Margie Maclin – General academic reading and writing

This course combines reading, writing, and vocabulary development to prepare students for full-time academic work. Work on advanced grammar specific to the needs of the students in the course is included. In addition to one section for general academic reading and writing, separate sections are offered in which instruction is customized to meet the language demands of students entering graduate/professional programs in business and law. The class meets 12.5 hours per week for six weeks. Tuition: \$2060

Frequently Asked Questions

Who is Eligible to Take ELP Courses?

ELP courses are open to non-native English speaking adults living in the St. Louis area as well as WUSTL students, faculty and staff. The courses are designed for individuals who have already achieved a high-intermediate to advanced level of proficiency in English and wish to polish their English language skills for academic and professional communication.

Will I Have to Pay Tuition?

Undergraduate Students: Undergraduates who are enrolled in a full-time degree program do not pay additional tuition or fees to take ELP coursework in the fall or spring semester, but do pay Summer School tuition in the summer.

Graduate Students: Graduate students should find out from their departments what the departmental policy is regarding payment for ELP courses.

WUSTL Employees: WUSTL employees who are eligible for the employee tuition benefit may generally apply that benefit to any ELP course; employees should review the complete tuition benefit policies at <http://ucollege.wustl.edu/employee-tuition-remission>

Postdoctoral Appointees: Postdoctoral appointees may take University College courses for professional development purposes at no cost under the Washington University Postdoctoral Appointee Tuition Policy. See <http://ucollege.wustl.edu/employee-tuition-remission>
