SELECTED COURSES TAUGHT

- PHIL 301 *Symbolic Logic (Washington University in St Louis)*
 An intermediate course in logic for students who have already taken at least one logic course. Topics covered included proof by induction, expressive adequacy, duality, first-order model theory, and a variety of styles of proof system. (spring 2010)
- PHIL 4051 *Philosophy of Logic (Washington University in St Louis)*
 An introduction to the philosophy of logic aimed at graduate students and upper-level under-graduates. Topics covered included the relation of logic to reasoning, the definition of logical consequence, the status of modal logic, critiques of classical logic, and logical pluralism. Assessment was by way of problem sets and a final term paper. (fall 2008)
- PHIL 100 *Introduction to Logic and Critical Analysis (Washington University in St Louis)*
 An introductory course in formal logic, covering semantics and proof systems for truth-functional and first-order predicate logics, as well as some basic metatheoretical techniques, and culminating in a proof of the completeness of our first-order proof system (fall 2008)
- PHIL 306 *Philosophy of Language (Washington University in St Louis)*
 An upper level undergraduate course in contemporary analytic philosophy of language, focusing on the topics of reference, meaning and truth (spring 2008)
- PHIL 502 *Proseminar: Frege and his Successors (Washington University in St Louis)*
 A graduate level course beginning with the *Foundations of Arithmetic* and studying important contributions to analytic philosophy, both in the philosophy of language and the philosophy of mathematics (fall 2007)
- PHIL 4065 *Advanced Philosophy of Language (Washington University in St Louis)*
 A graduate level course of which the first half was spent studying first order modal logic, and the second half studying areas of the philosophy of language where some technical knowledge of modal logic can help, including demonstratives, vagueness and relativism. Assessment was by way of problem sets and one paper. (spring 2007)
- PHIL 521 *Language and Knowledge (Washington University in St Louis)*
 A graduate seminar focusing on areas in philosophy of language that have been important to epistemology in recent times. Topics included the analytic/synthetic distinction, two-dimensionalism and contextualism. (fall 2006)
- PHIL 307 *Metaphysics and Epistemology (Washington University in St Louis)*
 An upper level undergraduate course in contemporary metaphysics and epistemology, focusing on the topics of existence, possibility, time, personhood, skepticism and justification (fall 2006)

PHIL 500 *Time and Time Travel* (Washington University in St Louis)

An independent study for an undergraduate major focusing on the consequences of the special theory of relativity for accounts of time, persistence through time, and time travel. (fall 2006)
